Adding a link-based solution

After you [create a catalog](https://cloud.google.com/private-catalog/docs/create-catalog) (https://cloud.google.com/private-catalog/docs/create-catalog), you can add a link-based solution solution, which your users can download.

To add a link-based solution to Private Catalog:

1. Go to the Cloud Console [Private Catalog](https://console.cloud.google.com/project/_/catalog) (https://console.cloud.google.com/project/_/catalog) page.

2. Click **Select** to choose the Google Cloud project.
3. Click **Manage solutions**.
4. From the list of catalogs, double-click the one that you're adding to.
5. Click **Add Link Solution**.
6. Enter a name for your solution, a description, and a tagline. The tagline is the short description shown on the tile in the end-user Private Catalog view.
7. Optionally, upload an icon for the solution.
8. Optionally enter a support link and contact information for the creator.
9. Optionally, add a link to the documentation for the solution.
10. Click **Add**.
