This topic describes how to clone the contents of a repository from Cloud Source Repositories to your local machine.

The following is required to clone the contents of a repository:

You must have <u>authentication on your local system</u> (/source-repositories/docs/authentication)
.

The steps to clone a repository vary depending on your authentication type (SSH, Cloud SDK, or manually generated credentials).

- You must have <u>a repository in Cloud Source Repositories</u> (/source-repositories/docs/creating-an-empty-repository).
- You must have <u>permissions to interact with the repository</u> (/source-repositories/docs/configure-access-control).

If you're not using manually generated credentials or the Cloud SDK, you can clone a repository by using SSH.

If you're not using SSH or manually generated credentials, you can clone a repository by using the Cloud SDK.

If you're not using SSH or the Cloud SDK, you can clone a repository by using manually generated credentials.
