This topic describes how to set up <u>Pub/Sub</u> (/pubsub/) notifications for Cloud Source Repositories.

1. Complete the steps from <u>Quickstart: Create a repository</u> (/source-repositories/docs/quickstart/).

After you complete that quickstart, you have an app you can deploy to App Engine.

2. Enable the Compute Engine API.

In this quickstart, the Compute Engine default service account is used to publish messages to Pub/Sub.

Enable the Compute Engine API (https://console.cloud.google.com/flows/enableapi?apiid=compute_component)

To get notifications for a Cloud Source Repositories project or repository, you must create a Pub/Sub topic. You can use either the Google Cloud Console or the gcloud command-line tool to create a topic. <u>Pub/Sub subscriptions</u> (/pubsub/docs/subscriber#create) let <u>subscribers</u> (/pubsub/docs/subscriber) receive messages from a repository's topic.

Using the gcloud command-line tool, associate a Pub/Sub topic with a specific repository:

Output similar to the following is displayed:

With Pub/Sub topics and subscriptions set up, push a change to the hello-world repository. This change lets you see the notification at work.

1. In a terminal window, go to the hello-world repository:

2. Edit the main.py file to read as follows:

3. Add the file so Git can commit it:

4. Commit the file:

5. Push the file to Cloud Source Repositories:

When you push a change to your repository, Pub/Sub sends a notification. To view this notification, enter the following command:

To delete your Pub/Sub resources, follow these steps.

1. In the GCP Console, go to the Pub/Sub **Topics** page.

- 2. Select the checkbox for any topic you want to permanently delete.
- 3. Click Delete 🧻 .
- 4. To delete any remaining subscriptions, display each one, and then click **Delete**

To delete the repository you created, follow these steps.

1. In the GCP Console, open the All repositories page for Cloud Source Repositories.

2. Hold the pointer over the repository you want to delete and click Settings 🏟.

The General settings page opens.

3. Click Delete this repository

The Remove repository dialog opens.
