1. Open the Cloud Storage browser in the Google Cloud Console.

2. In the list of buckets, click on the name of the bucket that contains the object you want to download, and navigate to the object.		
3. Click the <b>mo</b>	<b>re actions</b> menu ( ) associated with the object.	
4. Select Down	load.	

To easily download all objects in a bucket or subdirectory, use the <u>gsutil cp</u> (https://cloud.google.com/storage/docs/gsutil/commands/cp) command.
