Operations

Manages long-running operations with an API service.

When an API method normally takes long time to complete, it can be designed to return Operation

(https://cloud.google.com/talent-solution/job-search/docs/reference/rpc/google.longrunning#google.longrunning.Operation)

to the client, and the client can use this interface to receive the real response asynchronously by polling the operation resource, or pass the operation resource to another API (such as Google Cloud Pub/Sub API) to receive the response. Any API service that returns long-running operations should implement the **Operations** interface so developers can have a consistent client experience.

Starts asynchronous cancellation on a long-running operation. The server makes a best effort to cancel the operation, but success is not guaranteed. If the server doesn't support this method, it returns

google.rpc.Code.UNIMPLEMENTED. Clients can use Operations.GetOperation

(https://cloud.google.com/talent-solution/job-

search/docs/reference/rpc/google.longrunning#google.longrunning.Operations.GetOperation)

or other methods to check whether the cancellation succeeded or whether the operation completed despite cancellation. On successful cancellation, the operation is not deleted; instead, it becomes an operation with an **Operation.error**

Deletes a long-running operation. This method indicates that the client is no longer interested in the operation result. It does not cancel the operation. If the server doesn't support this method, it returns google.rpc.Code.UNIMPLEMENTED.

Lists operations that match the specified filter in the request. If the server doesn't support this method, it returns **UNIMPLEMENTED**.

NOTE: the name binding allows API services to override the binding to use different resource name schemes, such as users/*/operations. To override the binding, API services can add a binding such as "/v1/{name=users/*}/operations" to their service configuration. For backwards compatibility, the default name includes the operations collection id, however overriding users must ensure the name binding is the parent resource, without the operations collection id.

Waits for the specified long-running operation until it is done or reaches at most a specified timeout, returning the latest state. If the operation is already done, the latest state is immediately returned. If the timeout specified is greater than the default HTTP/RPC timeout, the HTTP/RPC timeout is used. If the server does not support this method, it returns <code>google.rpc.Code.UNIMPLEMENTED</code>. Note that this method is on a best-effort basis. It may return the latest state before the specified timeout (including immediately), meaning even an immediate response is no guarantee that the operation is done.

This resource represents a long-running operation that is the result of a network API call.

Fields	
name	string The server-assigned name, which is only unique within the same service that originally returns it. If you use the default HTTP mapping, the name
metadata	should be a resource name ending with operations/{unique_id}.
metadata	Any (https://developers.google.com/protocol- buffers/docs/reference/google.protobuf#google.protobuf.Any) Service-specific metadata associated with the operation. It typically contains progress information and common metadata such as create time. Some services might not provide such metadata. Any method that returns a long-running operation should document the metadata type, if any.
done	bool If the value is false, it means the operation is still in progress. If true, the operation is completed, and either error or response is available.
Union field result. The operation result, which can be either an error or a valid response. If done == false, neither error nor response is set. If done == true, exactly one of error or response is set. result can be only one of the following:	
error	Status (https://cloud.google.com/talent-solution/jobsearch/docs/reference/rpc/google.rpc#google.rpc.Status) The error result of the operation in case of failure or cancellation.

response	Any (https://developers.google.com/protocol- buffers/docs/reference/google.protobuf#google.protobuf.Any) The normal response of the operation in case of success. If the original method returns no data on success, such as Delete, the response is google.protobuf.Empty. If the original method is standard Get/Create/Update, the response should be the resource. For other methods, the response should have the type XxxResponse, where Xxx is the original method name. For example, if the original method name is TakeSnapshot(), the inferred response type is TakeSnapshotResponse.
